The Role of an Elder Law Attorney

- What does an Elder Law Attorney do?
 - Elder Law attorneys focus on the legal needs of seniors. Elder law attorneys work with elders and their families who need help locating appropriate coordinating public and private resources to pay for care and ensuring the elder's right to quality care.
- I already have an Estate Plan, do I still need an Elder Law Attorney?
 - Possibly. Many people engage an Elder Law attorney for his/her expertise in navigating the long term care "maze." Elder Law attorneys focus on assisting families who are managing, planning and paying for long-term care. Their services include qualifying for and applying for Medicaid and VA benefits, as well as estate planning issues.
- I am concerned about money, can I afford to meet with an Elder Law Attorney?
 - Although there is a fee for meeting with an Elder Law Attorney, the majority of people end up saving hundreds or thousands of dollars by getting professional guidance. Elder law attorneys are experienced in coordination of public and private benefits for long term care expenses. The real question is can you afford not to meet with an Elder Law Attorney?
